This state-of-the-art facility is located within walking-distance of Hadrian's Wall, giving the children the exciting opportunity to deepen their understanding of Roman Britain in a real-life context. The children were thrilled to experience ancient history first-hand when they visited the nearby Roman Fort of Vindolanda, where an on-going archaeological dig was taking place. As well as learning about the past, the children also learned about the diverse ecology of the local area, linking to their taught Science unit of Living Things and their Habitats. By taking part in a mini-beast hunt, the children enjoyed finding and identifying a wide range of living creatures using bug-catchers, magnifying glasses and identification sheets. To round of the residential visit, the children of Year 4 also developed their artistic skills through sketching Ancient Roman Pottery they had seen on the visit. Well done to everyone involved for making this a memorable two days in Northumberland.
